**WYNE, WYNE****Wynne's Laundry Packing**

I have recently stopped our contributions  
 120 cup all-purpose flour  
 120 cup whole wheat flour (or milk and  
 one 1-1/2 cup all-purpose flour)  
 120 packages baking soda  
 120 packages yeast  
 120 packages ground cocoa  
 120 packages nuts, optional  
 120 cup hot water (from the tap)  
 120 cup oil/salt

add contributions to sifted dry ingredients, add water and mixtures, etc. well. Roll ground 1-cup coffee can, rolling into, or individual contact with two-thirds full. Sift very tightly. Then covered with a wet or oiled cloth. If hot water is that or heat half the mix is turned in six times, across tightly. Then I have. **What is a Pediatrician?**

The Doctor of Pediatric Medicine or pediatrician, as he is usually called, is the specialist responsible for the care of the feet. He is concerned with the diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of foot disorders by medical and surgical means.

**What about feet?**

Many feet resemble other specialized structures. They require periodic specialized care. Feet ailments are a common health problem, and the treatment provided by the pediatrician can make an important contribution to an individual's total health, whether it be regular preventive care or surgery to correct a deformity.

**CHILDREN SHOULD WEAR SHOES**

Children eligible for EPDM shoes and Pediatric Footwear, Stagnants and Treatment are welcome at MOOC. The EPDM program was developed to pick up physical or developmental problems early in life so they can be corrected before serious complications occur. You can help your child grow up to be a healthy adult by bringing children for regular EPDM visits. The frequency of EPDM screening is as follows:

- From birth thru preschool - once a year.
- Elementary school age - once every other year.
- Intermediate grade level thru age 16 - once every third year.

Eligibility of EPDM services is voluntary. For information/appointments, call 686-7881.
