Center Receives \$500,000 Donation for the James & Abigail Campbell Keiki Clinic

The Health Center received its first major capital campaign donation from The James & Abigail Campbell Foundation to build a pediatric floor in the family medical center. Campbell Foundation family members presented its \$500,000 donation at a reception held at

the Health Center on November 15. The capital campaign, which kicked off in June, aims to raise \$3.19 million to build the family medical center, which will contain floors dedicated to primary and pediatric care.

“Currently, more than 7,000 children, from birth to 14, uti-

lize the WCCHC facilities annually. The new pediatric floor will give even more children from Waianae and surrounding communities access to full-service, integrated medical care in a modern facility,” said James Shingle, president of The James & Abigail Campbell Foundation. “It is with great pleasure the Foundation presents this donation of \$500,000 to the Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Center and the residents that will benefit from these new services.”

Richard Bettini, executive director of the Health Center, said the health needs have been steadily growing in West Oahu. “We are anticipating increased healthcare needs for the families who will soon transition off

of welfare and for those who have been laid off work.”

“This donation from the Campbell family comes at a crucial time and will be greatly appreciated by our community.”

In addition to the contribution to the Health Center, the Campbell family presented 100 families from the Waianae area with gift certificates to purchase turkeys and trimmings for their Thanksgiving Day family gatherings.

The James & Abigail Campbell Foundation was established in 1980 to honor the memory of James and Abigail Campbell. It is not funded by The Estate of James Campbell but by the individual members of the Campbell family – the grandchildren of pioneer businessman James Campbell. The Foundation is giving a total of \$1.4 million in grants this year – up from \$1.1 million last year.
