The Health Center is seeking artists to submit a design and budget to capture the concept of its capital campaign, **Sharing Traditions: Generation to Generation.**

The design must incorporate the capacity to engrave names of at least 1,000 individual donors. Designs/budgets are due June 14 with a selection announced July 15. If selected, the art piece will need to be completed by June 15, 2003.

Based on a severe shortage of clinic space, the Health Center's Board of Directors has approved plans for a new two-story family medical clinic and a two-year \$3,190,000 capital campaign – **Sharing Traditions** - to secure funding for its construction.

As of April 2002, the Health

Center has raised close to \$800,000.

That is the theme of the community portion of the capital campaign. The goal - \$200,000 - is focused on friends and family of the Health Center.
