Welcome to our Best Practices Garden, which is dedicated to the exceptional achievements developed across the country to improve the health and wellness of communities like ours.

The 'Iliahi a Lo'e (*S. ellipticum*) planted in the garden to the left is one of several species of Sandalwood found in the Hawaiian Islands. This particular species, also known as Coastal Sandalwood, is extremely variable in size and shape typically reaching a height of 3.3 to 16.4 feet with a canopy spread of 3.3 to 9.8 feet.

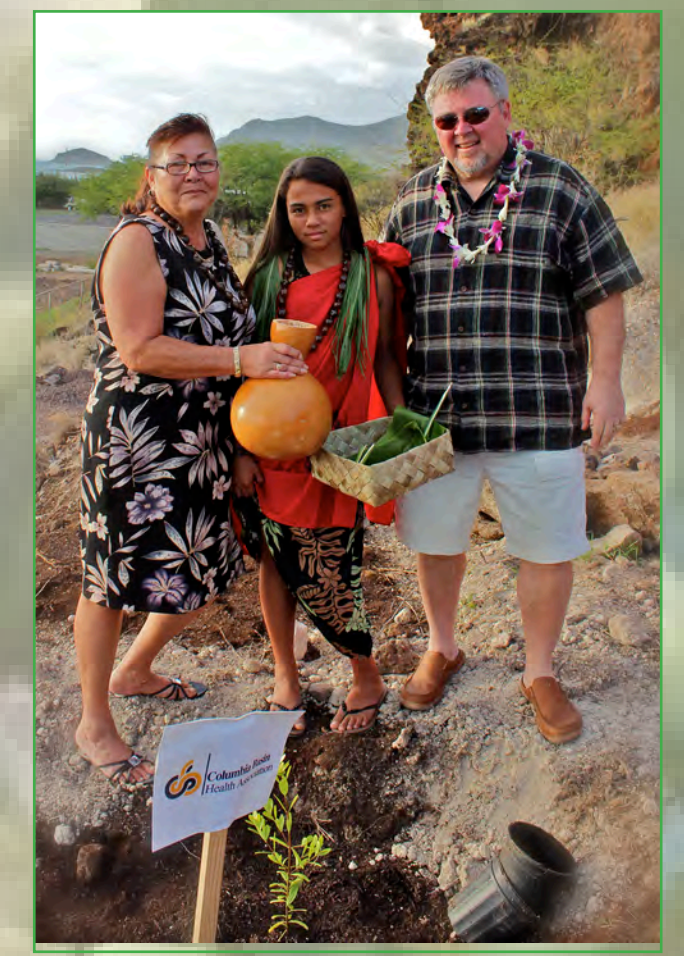
These 'Iliahi a Lo'e were planted on February 13, 2012 by the member health centers of Community Health Best Practices, LLC who had gathered on this site. During this traditional Native Hawaiian tree planting ceremony, local keiki (children) were partnered with a representative from each of the visiting health centers. The blessing bestowed during the ceremony will support the strong and healthy growth of the trees as well as the keiki who participated. On March 9, 2017, Best Practices LLC health center representatives gathered again to plant an 'Iliahi a Lo'e to welcome their newest member, Lone Star Circle of Care.

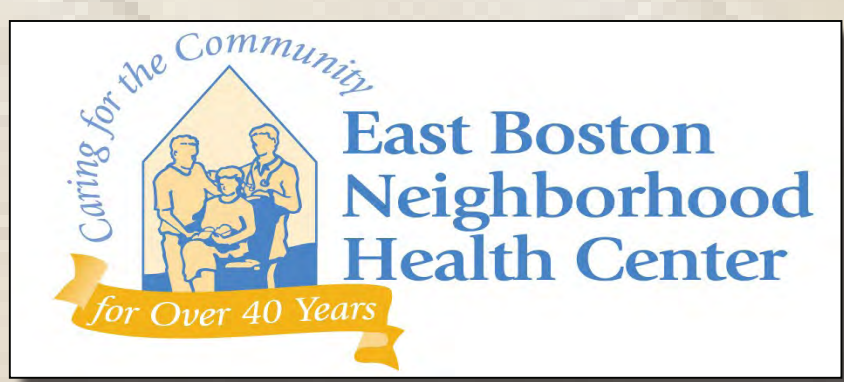
Below is a key identifying the Best Practices health centers and their 'Iliahi a Lo'e location:
